	Instructions	Tick
1	Call 999 if appropriate (unless already alerted)	
2	Ensure you are in no immediate danger	
4	Make yourself known to Incident Commander	
3	<ul> <li>Contact other Parish Councillors and Clerk if available to agree:</li> <li>Means of communication</li> <li>Suitable operational base, if necessary – ensure it can be reached safely</li> </ul>	
5	In consultation with Incident Commander agree actions and responsibilities.	
6	Consider impact on any vulnerable groups and any actions necessary. See page X	
7	Consider what to communicate , and to whom  - Parish Council website  - Hazlemere Residents Facebook page  - Local news media (Bucks Free Press, Wycombe Sound)  - Volunteer organisations	
8	Make sure you keep a log of decisions, actions, and information received (see Annex)	

# Next steps to support people who may be vulnerable

	Instructions	Tick
1	Identify those who may be particularly vulnerable to this particular emergency, e.g.	
	<ul> <li>People with a particular health condition or need that is affected,</li> <li>e.g. dependent on medical equipment</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>People who may find it difficult to evacuate because of age or disability</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>People who are isolated because of living alone, age, disability, digital exclusion, or difficulty with English</li> </ul>	
	- People who are carers	
	<ul> <li>People who are particularly vulnerable to anxiety, e.g. those with mental health issues</li> </ul>	
2	Provide manpower in liaison with County Adult Social Services Safeguarding team.	
3	Notify emergency services	
4	Encourage neighbours to look out for people at risk (using e.g. facebook page, local media)	
5	Establish what assistance is needed, and refer to relevant agencies:	
	- Evacuation	
	- Medical	
	- Care/befriending	
	- Shopping	
5	Be aware that some may seek to exploit the vulnerabilities of others, e.g. rogue traders offering repairs. Where possible, agree follow-up visits from local police or other trusted agency e.g. fire & rescue.	

## Next steps in case of an evacuation

	Instructions	Tick
1	Assist local emergency services with door knocking if required.	
2	The local authority is responsible for setting up a rest centre assist if required	
4	If asked, contact keyholders for possible emergency locations and ask them to stand by.	
5	If asked, contact organisations who may be able to provide volunteers.	



#### Lessons for future Council Emergency Planning following the Coronavirus pandemic in 2020

- Communicate and coordinate The Parish Council cannot count on 'the authorities' to have
  a plan. Someone just needs to get on and do what needs to be done, but it's vital to
  communicate with other bodies throughout and set up strong central coordination as soon
  as possible (even if you are working with fairly autonomous teams).
- **Reaching people** Speed is important in order to deal with the initial fear and confusion and good communication is key but not just online, the leaflet was vital. It is hard to reach those who most need help, but GPs and pharmacies are a key link.
- Safeguarding and confidentiality are even more important with such a local approach. Local people are fantastic and we had lots of volunteers, but they take time to manage properly. They must be given clear information on what is expected of them up front, with a number for them to ring if they need support.
- The Council's role The Council needs to decide early whether to get involved directly or indirectly. Work doesn't have to be led by the Parish Council and indeed our powers are limited, eg it cannot give donations to individuals but it was very useful having councillors involved. The link with the CIO (which has more flexibility to act) was very helpful, and the working group model provides the right flexibility and structure for linking up.
